August 9, 2021

CALL TO ORDER:

QUAKER VALLEY AMBULANCE AUTHORITY INCORPORATION RESOLUTION

The reason for the Ambulance Authority asking for a new Resolution three years before the expiration date is because Valley Ambulance was just re-authorized, and they would like to have both services synced to expire in the same year.
